## **OUR MISSION**

The National Library is a centre that holds the National Bibliographic Heritage of Spain and it aims to:

- Preserve, manage and disseminate the Spanish Bibliographic Heritage in any format
- Collect, catalogue and preserve the publications in any area
- Promote research, especially in the area of Humanities, by means of requests, study, book loan, etc.
- Elaborate and disseminate the information about the Spanish publications
- Carry out any library work, preservation, growth and dissemination of the National Bibliographic Heritage
- Develop research programs and cooperate with other libraries and other cultural and scientific institutions that can contribute to the best development of the aims of the National Library
- Create, coordinate and encourage research and development programs in the areas of its competency to satisfy the needs of the research community
- Contribute to the transformation of information into knowledge

## SUMMARY OF THE YEAR

The 400th century anniversary of *El Quijote* took up most of the efforts in 2005; conferences, theatre, musicals and educational workshops, including the *El Quijote: Biografía de un Libro* exhibition as a central ceremony were held from April to October at the National Library. More than 23.000 visitors enjoyed the exhibition of one of the most important collections of the novel in different languages and formats.

Rosa Regàs continues at the Direction of the Library and has worked to reestructure the organisational chart, promoting changes in management structures, staff development and training programmes. The New Plan for Digitisation has been developed as an instrument for the dissemination of the Spanish Bibliographic Heritage. The *Biblioteca Digital Hispánica* project included in this plan offers an opportunity to cooperate in this matter with other national and international libraries and cultural institutions. *The Biblioteca Digital Hispánica* aims to provide access to the *Bibliographic Treasures* of the Library in digital format.

It is expected that the Library will join The European Library as a full member by the end of 2006 and this will contribute to make the digitised collections of the Library more accesible to a wider audience.

In 2005 the cooperation with other National Libraries has been especially interesting in terms of sharing a common history, culture and language, with the National Library of Morocco, National Library of Portugal and some of the Libraries in South America integrated in ABINIA.

The cooperation with the National Library of Morocco resulted in a preservation project of their press collection from 1880 to 2004 that will be developed in the near future. Some experts visited the Library and shared experiences on this matter. Today, a strong cooperation with Morocco has been established and an agreement will be signed next autumn.

Library cooperation with Portugal has been focused mainly on digital matters and an agreement will be signed for specific projects and activities related to our common cultural heritage that could be included both in the European Library and ABINIA. A specific project called *Descubrimientos* will be developed with a first selection of a hundred titles of cartographic works and botanist and zoology discoveries.

The National Library of Spain coordinates together with ABINIA the development and implementation of the *Catálogo Colectivo de fondos musicales iberoamericanos*, a union catalogue of Latin American music holdings from 19<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> century. # THE RENOVATION OF THE LIBRARY MUSEUM

The reopening of the Library Museum was expected for the end of 2005 but there has been a delay due to the enormous works of restoration.

According to this renovation plan, the following priorities were appointed:

- The inclusion of spaces for learning and recreational activities (workshops/courses of restoration, artwork and illumination, printing, library users training, information retrieval, etc.)
- Exhibition of original works
- Profiling to nowadays museums reality, fixing the attention on users and giving preference to their needs

The Library Museum will remain closed until the end of 2006.

#### ACQUISITION, CATALOGUING AND PRESERVATION

#### LEGAL DEPOSIT

The National Library of Spain is the main information and document centre regarding Spanish and Latin American culture in written form, due to the status it has enjoyed as the depository body for published material in Spain since the beginning of 18th century, received by means of Legal Deposit. The bibliographic collection is also built up by remaining procedures like purchases, auctions, exchange and donations. [*See Figure 1*]

The Legal Deposit currently governed at a State level by means of the Orders of the Ministry of Education and Culture of 30th October 1971 and 20th February 1973 still needs a reform to redefine the person responsible for the deposit. The responsibility for supplying material is still assigned to printers, and it should be extended to publishers, producers and importers.

#### ACQUISITIONS

The Bibliographic Heritage Department of The National Library had a 2.000.000  $\in$  budged for the adquisitions in 2005 [See Figure 4].

## CATALOGUING

The Bibliographic Control Department develops the ARIADNA database that includes the cataloguing of all that it is published every year in Spain. Over the year 2005, 130.687 bibliographic records and 683.838 holdings have been entered into ARIADNA. It has also been entered 6.844 titles and 10.922 collections in the Union Catalogue of Serial Publications. [See Figure 2]

The National Library of Spain organised the *I Congress on International Cataloguing Principles: Influence and European Overview* as a parallel activity within the 9<sup>*a*</sup> Jornadas Españolas de Documentación held in Madrid on April 14<sup>th</sup> 2005. This was a great opportunity to exchange information and explore the consequences of the new principles in our cataloguing codes. We were very pleased to be able to share with other participants from all over Europe the cataloguing activity of their countries.

#### PRESERVATION

The Preservation and Conservation Area has published the 2005 digitisation projects with a total of 413.000 files obtained. Most of the items digitised were available in different supports but as the digitisation at the National Library of Spain have a double function - preservation and dissemination – it was decided to do so attending to a better dissemination of those works.

The digitised holdings come from the following:

- Press
- Historical Holdings: manuscripts, cartography, drawings and engravings.
- Collections by subject

## **CULTURAL ACTIVITIES**

#### **EXHIBITIONS**

Preparations for the *El Quijote* 400<sup>th</sup> century anniversary took up most of the efforts in 2005 at the National Library; conferences, theatre, musicals and educational workshops, including the exhibition of *El Quijote: Biografía de un Libro* held from April to October 2005.

The exhibition *Biblioteca en guerra* showed the work at the Library during the three years of the Spanish Civil War. Hundreds of visitors remembered that moment of history in Spain and in the Library.

#### **CONFERENCES**

A very interesting Season of Conferences was presented for 2005; several themes were selected for the season the most outstanding of which were *Biblioteca de...* (=*Library of...*) and *Poetas en Vivo* (= *Poets in Live...*).

## SERVICE TO READERS

In December 2004, the new Library Norms of Access were published and there was an increase in the number of users. The first aim of the Library for 2005 was to address those new users to the right place attending to their particular needs and expectations. We have noticed over the past few years that in a way not everybody had free access to the Library; in fact it was only addressed to researchers and closed for a huge number of citizens that only wanted to visit the Library as they were curious to see what was kept inside. The Direction of the Library decided to start an *Open Doors Day* to offer everybody the possibility of visiting the Library and have a nice visit along some of the most beautiful Bibliographic Treasures of the Library.
