

### OUR MISSION

The National Library is a centre that holds the National Bibliographic Heritage of Spain and it aims to:

- Preserve, manage and disseminate the Spanish Bibliographic Heritage in any format
- Collect, catalogue and preserve the publications in any area
- Promote research, especially in the area of Humanities, by means of requests, study, book loan, etc.
- Elaborate and disseminate the information about the Spanish publications
- Carry out any library work, preservation, growth and dissemination of the National Bibliographic Heritage
- Develop research programs and cooperate with other libraries and other cultural and scientific institutions that can contribute to the best development of the aims of the National Library
- Create, coordinate and encourage research and development programs in the areas of its competency to satisfy the needs of the research community
- Contribute to the transformation of information into knowledge

### SUMMARY OF THE YEAR

The National Library Strategic Plan for 2006-2008 has been implemented with excellent results, especially in terms of increasing the number of visitors and consequently widening access to the Spanish Bibliographic Heritage. We have tried to improve participation of citizens in library cultural activities: an Open Doors Day was held with huge success and the Library Museum was finally opened after years of restoration. Following this purpose, the renovations planned years before were accomplished and interesting changes in the use of space were introduced at the Library; a new place for users was created with new services to readers (free Internet access, newcomers' reception, etc.).

The National Library of Spain has initiated the process of implementing an Integrated Library Management System that will replace the existing Ariadna system. This new system will allow the development of a wide range of services for users. This project will be developed over the next two years, with an initial phase devoted to the migration of over 3,000,000 bibliographic references that are currently available and to the implementation of the cataloguing and authority control module and the Internet user consultation module (OPAC). The second phase will include the implementation of purchase, traffic and serial publications management modules.

In 2006 the National Library of Spain cooperation with other National Libraries was strengthened and an agreement was signed with the National Library of Morocco following the cooperation started in 2004 with a bibliographic control and preservation project of their serial publications from 1880 to 2004. On the other hand, we continue working with some of the libraries in South America integrated in ABINIA and coordinating the development and implementation of the *Catálogo Colectivo de Fondos Musicales Iberoamericanos*, a union catalogue of Latin American music holdings from 19th to 20th century.

The National Library of Spain has made a big effort in terms of digitisation in 2006. Within the plan for the development of the Information Society in Spain for 2006-2010 with the support of the Corporate Public Entity dependent on the Ministry of Industry, *Red.es*, to the cultural heritage digitisation that in 2006 has been defined in an agreement with the Spanish National Library. The purpose of this collaboration framework agreement is to implement the "Hispanic Digital Library" programme and was signed on 30 June 2006. The purpose of this Agreement is to implement a project for the digitisation and dissemination of the emblematic works of the Library in accordance with the guidelines and strategies of other European countries, as well as to sponsor the creation of a "Hispanic Digital Library" that will allow the largest documentary collection in the country to be offered to the public, a service that would allow researching, consulting and analysing the fundamental texts of the Hispanic culture. This project, that will have a great impact in the Latin American culture, will favour the development of a national digital library system and will facilitate the necessary access infrastructure to disseminate all the digitisation initiatives carried out in the national territory, channelling this information through the European Digital Library. Thanks to this agreement, *Red.es* will support the Spanish National Library in the development of the necessary technological infrastructures to implement its digital library in accordance with the international standards and in an OIA-PHM protocol compatible system, as well as in the migration of more than 20,000 digital objects now available and the digitisation of 200 emblematic pieces.

## DIGITISATION ACTIVITIES

Due to the support of *Red.es*, the Spanish National Library is soon going to introduce a new technological infrastructure that will allow to disseminate and integrate in the future European Digital Library all the digital objects now available, forming the Hispanic Digital Library where all the Spanish cultural entities will be invited to participate. The first step in this European integration is now being carried out by including all the digital collections of the Spanish National Library in The European Library (TEL) (<http://www.theeuropeanlibrary.org/portal/index.htm>), the portal that gives access to the European National Library collections and is now configured as a basis of the European Digital Library project. The incorporation of the Spanish National Library in TEL is furthermore undertaken with the support of the European Commission, through the EDL project (<http://edlproject.eu/>).

The Spanish National Library has implemented its Hispanic Digital Library project started at 2006 with the publication in March 2007 of its Digital Newspaper Archive (<http://hemerotecadigital.bne.es/inicio.htm>). In this first phase, the public is given access to the digital collection of historic Spanish press contained in the Library, initially composed of 143 titles, published between 1772 and 1933, which represents the possibility of consulting around 500,000 digitalised pages. The criterion behind the composition of this collection has been the selection of the most representative newspapers and magazines of their era, reflecting the thematic richness of the Spanish newspaper publication and for which complete collections will be preserved. Those visiting the newspaper library will find political press as well as satiric, humoristic, scientific, religious, illustrated, amusing, sports, artistic, literary press, among others. The offer of titles will be extended to cover the historic evolution of the Spanish press. During 2007 it is planned to progressively incorporate new publications edited in the 17th and 18th centuries, as well as to incorporate press headlines that are essential for the study of the 19th century. The application that manages this collection allows to make searches by a specific title, as well as by a group of publications edited in a specific place or on a specific date. The format of the digital publications is PDF with OCR that allows any topic to be browsed within the text of the publication. As a result of these new text search possibilities, the Digital Newspaper Library has become a fantastic research tool.

Since 2006, the Spanish National Library has been participating in the Michael project (Multilingual Inventory of Cultural Heritage in Europe) through the eContent Michael Plus and it has already started the process of creating a Spanish national inventory and at present it has installed a trial server and has translated the Michael data model into Spanish.

In March 2006, the Subdirectorato for Library Coordination of the Ministry of Culture, in collaboration with the Spanish National Library, organised the Conference on Digital Heritage Preservation (<http://www.mcu.es/bibliotecas/CE/jppd/index.htm>) at the proposal of the Digital Preservation Working Group of the library cooperation forum of the Ministry of Culture and Autonomous Regions. During this conference the scenario and situation of the core concepts and of the main Spanish and European initiatives regarding digital preservation were discussed.

## LEGAL DEPOSIT

The National Library of Spain is the main information and document centre regarding Spanish and Latin American culture in written form, due to the status it has enjoyed as the depository body for published material in Spain since the beginning of 18th century, received by means of Legal Deposit. The bibliographic collection is also built up by remaining procedures like purchases, auctions, exchange and donations.

The Legal Deposit is currently governed at a State level by means of the Orders of the Ministry of Education and Culture of 30th October 1971 and 20th February 1973, but the National Library together with the Library Cooperation Forum of the Ministry of Culture and the Autonomous Regions, tried to instigate a new law on Legal Deposit to guarantee the preservation of Spanish digital contents, given that the current legislation does not envisage this essential task. In this sense, the Government will have to refer a bill of law to the Congress within a year to approach closely to reality the new rules to be passed next July 2007.

## THE OPENING OF THE LIBRARY MUSEUM

The Library Museum was finally opened last February 2007 offering a variety of learning and cultural activities giving preference to users needs.

## CATALOGUING

The Bibliographic Control Department develops the database that includes the cataloguing of all that it is published every year in Spain. Over the year 2006, 183.674 bibliographic records and 776.967 holdings have been entered into the database. It has also been entered 3.951 titles and 5.890 collections in the Union Catalogue of Serial Publications. [See *Figure 1*]

## CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

### Exhibitions

A total of 9 exhibitions were held at the National Library in 2006, the most outstanding of which were the *Rembrandt* exhibition with family portraits of the artist, landscapes, etc., and an exhibition to remember 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Spanish Civil War with a collection of drawings made by children during the conflict.
