

# Why do we want to do this?

- Our 1972 Act of Parliament requires us to support "industry"
- We incorporate the UK's official library collection of patents
- In our Living Knowledge vision (2015), we made support for business one of our six key Purposes:



"We help businesses to innovate and grow"



# A new kind of space within the Library

- In 2006 we created our first Business and Intellectual Property Centre
- "BIPC" is a physical hub where people can come together to learn, network and access free and low-cost information and support in protecting and commercialising a business idea.

## Expanding the model across the UK

- In 2012 we launched our BIPC 'National Network', initially with 6 partners
- Each BIPC follows the same model as the British Library BIPC in London
- £13m Government investment in 2020
  to grow to 20 Centres by 2023
- Delivered in core cities, towns and counties (urban, rural, coastal)



# BIPC Network – Supporting the economy

Business & IP Centre Network

Libraries as engines of economic growth

A three-year economic Impact analysis (January 2016 – December 2018) July 2019



- Creating enterprise The network supported the creation of 12,288 businesses
- Creating jobs An estimated total of 7,843 jobs
- Increasing turnover Net additional sales growth was an estimated £239 million
- Boosting local economies Net additional Gross Value Added was an estimated £78m
- Return on Investment £6.95 for every £1

# BIPC Network – Supporting social inclusion



Of the Business & IP Centre patrons who went on to start a new business:

- 55% were women (65% in London)
- 31% were from a black and Asian minority ethnic background (44% in London)
- 17% had a disability
- 22% of users drawn from the top 20% of the most deprived areas in the UK.

# Responding to the pandemic

- BIPC quickly pivoted to 100% digital delivery
- During 2020/21 we supported 26,000 patrons across the BIPC Network
- In October 2020 we launched Reset. Restart, a tailored programme of advice and support to help existing SMEs weather the storm
- To mark the start of the programme we held an online panel event 'The Road to Renewal: Preparing entrepreneurs and SMEs for the next normal'

# What next for the BIPC Network?

- Due to the high demand for, and success of the programme, we continued to run *Reset Restart* throughout 2021 and have secured corporate sponsorship to extend the programme in 2022-23
- Planning for long-term sustainability and future expansion of the BIPC National Network, in line with the next phase of British Library strategy beyond *Living Knowledge*
- Exploring opportunities to work with Central Government as a core part of the wider business support landscape, reaching parts of the community that other national programmes cannot reach and delivering proven economic impact
